The student masters the subject in modules. The grade is equivalent to the number of points earned (see tables). Points are earned in three ways:

SEMINAR PAPERS: In this way, the student can earn up to 20 points. Each student receives a topic for a seminar paper in each module that he teaches in written form. The preparation, content and form of the seminar paper are evaluated. A list of topics for term papers will be offered to students at the beginning of each module.

EVALUATION OF THE CLINICAL SEMINAR: In this way, the student can gain up to 20 points. Preparedness, manner of presentation, inclusion of others in the discussion are evaluated. The list of topics for clinical seminars will be offered to students in the first term of the course (one seminar can be prepared by one or more students).

FINAL TEST: In this way, the student can gain up to 60 points
